The following rules apply to each participating group/production team:

- 1. The 48-Hour Cinema Showdown will occur beginning at 6:00PM EST on Friday, February 3rd and ending at 6:00PM EST on Sunday, February 5th.
 - a. The participating group must complete its film work in time to deliver it to Pruis Hall on Sunday, February 5th, 2023 by 6:00 pm. Only films that meet the deadline will be screened.
- **2.** The only work to begin prior to the official 48-hour time period is crew organization, cast organization, equipment checkout, and location scouting. Within the 48-hour period, all creativity will take place, including but not limited to: writing the script, rehearsing, costume/set design, filming, editing, sound design, etc.
- **3.** All footage must be shot within the 48-hour time period of the project. No stock footage or footage shot or created at any other time may be used. Animation and special effects are permitted, but must be created during the 48-hour time period, unless the animation is an identifying mark for a participating team, and not a film.
- 4. Each participating group must have a representative at the official Kickoff Event in the Letterman Lobby at 6:00pm on Friday of the 48-Hour Showdown. To qualify as an "Official 48-Hour Showdown Student Film," each group's film must be in the genre it selects and must contain all required elements. At the event, each group will choose the genre of its film in a random drawing. In addition, each group will be assigned required elements that must appear in its film, such as a prop and line of dialogue. No swapping of genre, prop, or dialogue.
- **5.** The team leader and crew MUST be Ball State University students. All cast must be volunteers and a majority of the cast are encouraged, but not required, to be Ball State University students.
- **6.** The finished film must be between <u>2 minutes and 5 minutes in duration</u>. Credits (does not count towards film duration) at the end of each film are limited to a maximum of 45 seconds.
- 7. Films must include the following credit: "This film was made as part of the 48-Hour Cinema Showdown."
- **8.** Any type of digital camera may be used, however, a maximum of one university-owned camera may be used.
- **9.** The finished film must be on a flash drive and handed to a representative at Pruis Hall. Please use the format/code h.265. If we cannot view your film on our equipment, it WILL be disgualified.

- 10. Each team must secure talent releases and location releases, which must be turned in to the project organizers with the finished film. These releases are available at 48hours.epizy.com. The film will not be screened before the signed releases are received.
- 11. <u>Each team must secure music releases.</u> Participating groups are encouraged to work with local composers and/or musicians to write and record music for the films. We realize that this may be difficult to achieve, therefore, it is permissible for a participating group to use pre recorded music. HOWEVER, the participating group must have the rights to any music used in its film. A music release form will be provided.

12. Before the finished film begins, it must have 16 seconds consisting of:

- a. 3 seconds of black
- b. 10 second Title card consisting of:
 - i. Team Name
 - ii. Title of Film
 - iii. Prop
 - iv. Line of Dialogue
 - v. Genre
- c. 3 seconds of black
- d. This does not count towards your total duration.
- 12. Content of the film is at the discretion of the participating groups. The organizers reserve the right to not screen any film that can be considered pornographic, or that depicts hard-core or graphic sex, gratuitous violence, or illicit drug use. No on-screen deaths can occur.
- 13. If your film contains any elements of flashing lights, self-harm, discrimination, insinuations of suicide, sexual assault, or any other triggering or sensitive content <u>you must have a GRAPHIC</u>

 <u>WARNING title card at the beginning of your film viewable for a minimum 5 seconds (which does not count towards your final duration).</u>
- 14. To be certified as an official 48-Hour Showdown film, each participating group's film production must follow all rules herein. The Showdown Project Organizers reserve the right to screen only certified official 48-Hour films.
- 15. All certified official 48-hour films are eligible to compete for the title of Contest Winner. A panel of independent judges will determine the winners.
- 16. The producer/team leader for each group must submit a signed "Participation Agreement" with their entry form.
- 17. The 48-Hour Showdown Project Organizers may add to or amend these rules at any time prior to the beginning of the 48-hour time period.
